NEW CONDITION FOR ATTAINING THE TITLE OF MALAYSIAN CHAMPION AND MALAYSIAN GRAND CHAMPION

1. MALAYSIAN CHAMPION

A few years ago, the MKA introduced the points system whereby a dog by accumulating 36 points would be granted the title of Malaysian Champion:- 12 points were awarded for first place, 4 points for second place and 2 points for third place. This meant that a dog that has never won a first place in the unbeaten class could become a champion. This practice has led to decline in the standards of the breeds in Malaysia.

Therefore with effect from 1st January 2007 a dog can attain the title of Malaysian Champion if it won 3 Challenge Certificates under 3 different judges **or** 1 Challenge Certificate and 9 Reserve Challenge Certificates **or** 2 Challenge Certificates and 6 Reserve Challenge Certificates.

If a judge has previously awarded a Challenge Certificate for a dog, and subsequently judges the same dog within 1 year from the date of the previous show, a challenge certificate awarded at the show will not be valid towards attaining the title of Malaysian Champion.

2. GRAND CHAMPION

To attain the title of Grand Champion a dog will be required to win 10 Challenge Certificates + Three (3) Best In Show
